

Regulations

Art. 1 The competition

- The competition is open to pianists of all nationalities.
- Candidates under the age of 18 years old must provide agreement of the legal representative when registering.
- The competition is divided into four levels according to the age of the pianists.
- In each level, the candidate will perform, in the order of his or her choice, a programme including a compulsory etude by Hélène de Montgeroult and at least two pieces of different styles and periods. Playing by heart is strongly recommended but not compulsory.

The candidate must **strictly observe the total timing** set for each level, including pauses.

• The total number of candidates is limited to 40. In principle, 10 per category.

New: A pre-selection will be made on video. At the same time as registering, candidates must send a recent video recording. This video can simply be made using a mobile phone. The programme is free. The pieces recorded may be played at the competition. The length of the recording is specified for each level.

These videos can be transmitted via a Youtube link (not listed) or by Swisstransfer. The links must be indicated on the registration form.

 Candidates will be notified of the results of the pre-selection process by 20 June 2025 at the latest.

Art. 2 Programme

Level 1: This level is for pianists born on or after 1 January 2013

Etude n° 7 in E minor. « Pour que [les deux mains] fassent également bien des traits semblables »

The total time must be between 5 and 9 minutes.

Video: Free programm 2-3 minutes

Level 2: This level is for pianists born between 1 January 2010 and 31 December 2012.

Etude n° 29 in C minor. « Pour parcourir le clavier avec netteté »

The total timing must be between 7 and 12 minutes.

Video: Free programm 2-3 minutes

Level 3: This level is for pianists born between 1 January 2008 and 31 December 2009.

Etude no. 62 in E flat major «Étude de main gauche. Pour apprendre à chanter en se croisant sur la droite »

The total time must be between 9 and 14 minutes.

Video: Free programm 3-5 minutes

Level 4: This level is for pianists born between 1 January 2005 and 31 December 2007.

Etude No. 107 in D minor « Étude de main gauche. Pour lui donner de la rapidité dans un trait continu »

The total time must be between 12 and 18 minutes

Video: Free programm 3-5 minutes

It should be noted that the organiser cannot accept works for prepared piano.

Art. 3 Course of action

- The rounds will take place on **Saturday 15 November 2025** all day long and **Sunday 16 November 2025 until 2.30 p.m.** The schedule of the competition will be established as soon as registrations are closed but no later than **15 July 2025**
- The prize-giving concert will take place on Sunday 16 November 2025 at 3.30 pm.
- All rounds and the prize-giving concert will take place in the Bicubic hall in Romont (Switzerland) on a Steinway D.
- Rehearsal studios will be available according to a fair distribution plan set by the organisers.
- The organisers reserve the right to cancel a category if there are not enough candidates.

Art. 4 Registration and accommodation

• Registration will be possible between 1 and 31 May (11:59 pm) 2025.

Registration is online only. It will be taken into account on receipt of a file including all of the below:

- a list of the works selected for the competition
- o total timings (including the compulsory study of Hélène de Montgeroult and the pauses)
- o a good quality photo (300 dpi) for the booklet introducing the candidates
- voutube or swiss transfer link for the preselection video
- the proof of payment of the registration fee
- o a signed agreement of the legal representative (for candidates under 18)
- on arrival at the competition, candidates must spontaneously present a document proving their identity and age.
- In the event of a change in the programme, the organiser must be notified by 15 September 2025 at the latest.
- Accommodation is at the expense of the candidate unless a host family is available.

Art. 5 Registration fee

• The registration fees are fixed as follows:

Level 1: 30 CHF Level 2: 40 CHF Level 3: 50 CHF Level 4: 60 CHF

• The entry fee will only be refunded if the competition or a grade is cancelled by the organiser. In all other cases, it is due.

Art. 6 Invitations

- The candidate will be acknowlegded by e-mail as soon as the organiser has received his/her complete registration file. Confirmation of admission to the competition will be sent no later than 20 June 2025
- The schedule of the competition will be communicated no later than 15 July 2025

Art. 7 The jury

- Members of the jury are chosen by the organisers for their artistic and educational skill.
- The jury reserves the right to interrupt a candidate during the competition.
- The jury reserves the right not to award all prizes.
- The jury's decisions are final and cannot be appealed.
- At the end of the competition, candidates will receive constructive feedback from the jury members.

Art. 8 Awards

Prizes are set for each level, as follow:

Level 1

First prize: 200 CHF Second prize: 100 CHF Third prize: 50 CHF

Level 2

First prize: 300 CHF Second prize: 150 CHF Third prize: 100 CHF

Level 3

First prize: 400 CHF Second prize: 200 CHF Third prize: 150 CHF

Level 4

First prize: 500 CHF Second prize: 250 CHF Third prize: 200 CHF

Special prizes may be added. Please check our website.

- The results will be announced at the end of each level.
- The prizes will be awarded during the winners' concert on Sunday afternoon.

Art. 9 Communication et droit à l'image

- All the performances are open to the public and free of charge.
- Candidates authorise the recording, broadcasting and retransmission of their performances on any medium without financial consideration.

Art. 10 Acceptance of the regulations.

- Any registration to the competition implies the acceptance of the regulations.
- In the event of a dispute, the French version of the regulations will prevail.
